**PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN AT RISK**

The Port Edwards School District will annually identify students meeting the statutory definition of children at risk in accordance with state laws and regulations and the district's established plan. Students and parents of students identified as being at risk will receive a notification of the student's eligibility into the district's Avenues Toward Success program. Upon the acceptance of the placement by the student or a parent, the child will be immediately enrolled.

Avenues Toward Success Guidelines

- A. Curriculum Modification Options
  - 1. Tutorial Program - defined as one teacher or instructional aide being assigned and allotted the time to act as a tutor to the child
  - 2. Homogeneous grouping where applicable
  - 3. Summer school designed to meet basic academic skills area
  - 4. Leveled instructional material
  - 5. Modification of class requirements
  - 6. Use of specialists in areas of reading consultation
  - 7. Vocational courses at Mid-State Technical College
- B. Alternative Programming Options
  - 1. Academic grade placement for various content areas will be at level appropriate for achievement and not necessarily at homeroom, grade, or age level.
  - 2. Tutorial programming.
- C. Remedial Instruction Options
  - 1. Reading
  - 2. Math
  - 3. Summer school
- D. Parental Involvement Goals
  - 1. The parent of the Student At Risk will take a cooperative, active part in the development of the specific academic program necessary in meeting the student's needs.
  - 2. The parent will follow up and continually support the specifically designed program and will be responsible for ongoing communications with teachers and the guidance counselors concerning the child's program progress.
